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Background

School holidays can be particular pressure points for some families because of increased costs (such as food and childcare and energy bills in winter months) and reduced incomes.

This can lead to a holiday experience gap - with children from disadvantaged families less likely to access organised out-of-school activities;

They are also more likely to experience 'unhealthy holidays' in terms of nutrition and physical health; and more likely to experience social isolation.



Aims of the programme

There are many benefits for children who attend the HAF programme. We want to encourage all HAF providers to ensure a high quality experience that will result in children:

- receiving healthy and nutritious meals
- maintaining a healthy level of physical activity
- being happy, having fun and meeting new friends
- developing a greater understanding of food, nutrition and other health-related issues
- taking part in fun and engaging activities that support their development
- feeling safe and secure
- getting access to the right support services
- returning to school feeling engaged and ready to learn

Families can also benefit, when HAF providers include their needs in planning and delivering their programme. This could be through:

providing opportunities to get involved in cookery classes ensuring they are signposted towards other sources of information and support, such as health services or employment and education opportunities



Slough HAF Booking System

All bookings are managed by the Slough HAF booking system, each provider receives login details to edit and maintain their provider page. Providers can also manage bookings via the various features such as:

- Monitoring live bookings as they come in
- Viewing contact information for bookings
- Viewing allergy information
- Viewing if parent has shared if the child has any Special Educational Needs or disabilities
- Cancelling bookings on behalf parents
- Viewing Cancelled bookings
- Downloading attendance sheet
- Printing name tags
- Supporting parents with bookings

Once your application is successful, the HAF team will contact you to arrange training.



Application form

Slough HAF utilising a scoring matrix to evaluate applications, providers can charge a rate per child subject to where their scored on the matrix. The matrix can be found within the application, and it is recommended all providers read the matrix before completing the application.

The requirement is all clubs register as a food business. As you are only serving the food you still have a degree of responsibility to ensure that the food you serve is safe.
